THE ROMANTIC PERIOD(1798-1832)

Historical-social-literary context

New language and verse form-the rediscovery of the imagination-the Romantic conception of nature-the lyrical ballads as the manifesto of the Romantic movement.

The second generation of poets

JOHN KEATS: life-works-the pure artist-search for beauty-his message "beauty is truth, truth beauty-that is all" (ode on a Grecian Urn)

THE VICTORIAN AGE(1832-1875)

Historical-social-literary context

The new current of thought: the death of Romantic idealism and sensitiveness-optimism-Materialism and Utilitarianism-the Victorian Compromise.

The Victorian novel:realism-didactic aim-social orientation

CHARLES DICKENS: life-works-the humanitarian novelist-realism and optimism-his conception on Capitalism-his humour-painter of english life-his greatness-his limitations.

THE ANTI-VICTORIAN REACTION (1875-1914)

The decline of Victorian optimism and balance-the refusal of traditional standards and reaction to Victoria Puritanism-the return to literary individualism-The Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood-the Aesthetic movement:the theory of "art for art's sake"-european Decadentism.
